REASONS FOR REFERRAL TO A CONCUSSION SPECIALIST

Complex developmental, medical, psychiatric, school history making diagnosis and/or management difficult to determine Symptoms >1 month
No significant change in recovery status (less than 20% improvement) over a 2 week period
No change in academic progress over 2 weeks (no change in the accommodations on the STAMP and stage of academic support on the Gradual Return to School scale)
 Presence of significant risk factors (e.g., medical, developmental, behavioral, psychosocial) contributing to prolonged recovery
Requires more intensive school program recommendations
Significant emotional factors potentially interfering with recovery
Abnormal neurologic exam or atypical neurologic symptoms
History of multiple concussions to assess risk/vulnerability
Confirm clearance for return to risk activities

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
