



You are invited to present at this year's Future of Pediatrics 2021: A Virtual Summer Series!

This year's Future of Pediatrics program will be offered as a virtual series. The bi-weekly series will begin on Tuesday, June 15, 2021 from 12-1 p.m. and continue through August 24, 2021. We are planning six 1-hour webinars, each consisting of two 30-minute talks. We are now soliciting speakers and topics for these 30-minute CME presentations.

Proposals are due by Friday, April 16 so that we can publicize the topics and presenters in a timely manner. Please use the 1-page application on our [PHN website](#). Keep in mind that our audience prefers short, tight, and clinically practical presentations. Presentation slots are 30 minutes - generally 20 minutes for content and 10 minutes for Q&A. (Think TED talk.) Presentation slides, speaker bios and CME conflict of interest statements will be due one week before your presentation date. What makes a great "Future of Pediatrics" CME presentation topic? The best presentations feature topics that specifically address collaborative "shared care" between referring community pediatricians and Children's National specialists.

Considerations for presentation topics and content include:

- What are examples of successful co-management strategies for the condition you are addressing?
- Who should be referred sooner for better outcomes and what critical clinical information do you need to ensure a high-quality consultation?
- What common conditions can better be managed or followed in the primary care setting?
- What should be communicated and co-managed between PCP, specialist and family?
- What changes in condition management have occurred due to COVID-19?
- What studies, medications, or treatments are most cost-effective?
- How can telemedicine be used effectively to manage the patient in primary care, specialty care, or both?

Please plan to provide related enduring materials that can be posted on our website such as patient education, management algorithms, red flags for referrals, dosing charts, etc.
