Target Audience

Paediatricians, Family Physician, Nurses, Advanced Practice Providers and others involved in primary care.

Desired Outcomes

At the conclusion of this program, participants should be able to:

- Apply key elements of patient history, FH, and physical exam to determine when to treat and when to refer.
- Explain the potential consequences of underlying conditions to differentiate benign from severe.
- Recognize the anatomy and physiology of abnormalities including those that may require an intervention.
