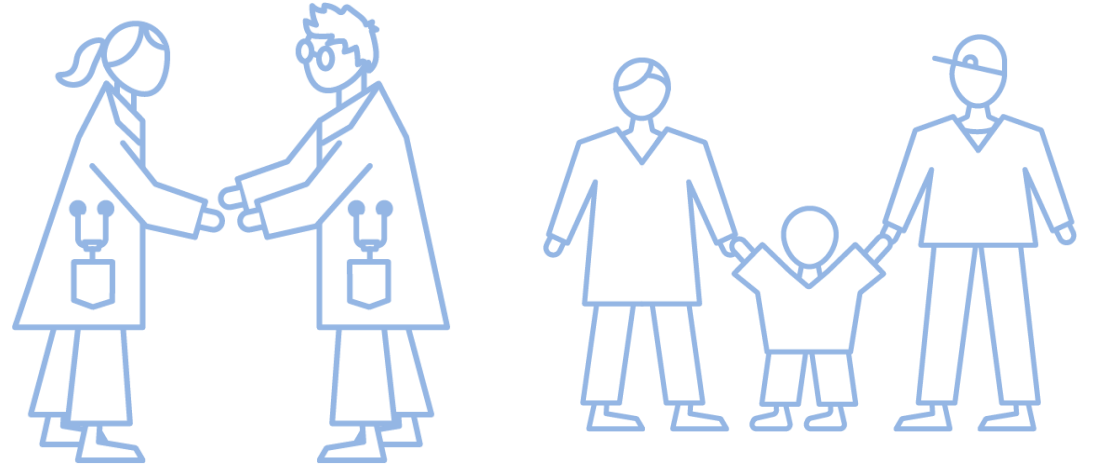
Who can claim CME credit?

- **Physicians, Physician Assistants, Nurse Practitioners, and Registered Nurses are eligible to receive CME credits.**

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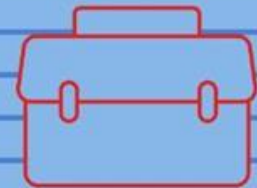
